### **A MESSAGE FROM ORFORD MUSEUM COMMITTEE:**

#### **Don't throw away £43.10p!**

The ticket for free access to Orford Castle and Orford Ness for local residents enclosed in this month's issue of The Link is worth up to £43.10 (the price of an English Heritage family ticket the National Trust ferry and admission charges for 2 adults and 3 children).

This magnificent gift from Orford Museum is negotiated every year with English Heritage and the National Trust so that you can visit your historic heritage sites and local museum without charge over the weekend of Friday 13<sup>th</sup>, Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> July.

Full details (including booking arrangements for Orford Ness) are to be found on the ticket, which you must fill in and present to staff. Please note that the concession is for local resident families - not for casual visitors or people renting holiday properties.

Volunteers from the museum prepare and print the tickets and put them into every copy of the magazine. Although take-up of the trips to Orford Ness is good, only a tiny proportion of the total number of tickets distributed for entrance to the castle and museum is used. Please help us to feel that our efforts are worthwhile by putting the dates into your diary now and using your valuable tickets.

Those visiting Orford Ness on 15<sup>th</sup> July will be able to attend performances and view the sculptures that make up this year's major arts project 'Untrue Island'. See the National Trust's leaflet, also enclosed in The Link, for details.

Use your free admission ticket to come to the castle and help us celebrate the opening of our new 'Museum in a Drawer' which is the museum's collection of finds made by local children during the past two years. It is a collection of objects found by children for children – parents and other adults can look too! Open the drawer in Case 5 and shine a torch on some very exciting things. The collection will be opened by Suvi McCreadie and Piers Pool, on whose land many of the objects were found, on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> July at 4.00pm. ### UNTRUE ISLAND

ORFORD NESS

8-30 JULY 2012

The haunting landscape of Orford Ness, with its Atomic Weapons Research Establishment laboratories, form the backdrop for the Untrue Island project this July. Initiated and developed by Commissions East and the National Trust, it brings together writer Robert Macfarlane, jazz musician Arnie Somogyi, and visual artists Jane and Louise Wilson.

"The theme of Untrue Island is the many 'voices' of the Ness," says writer Robert Macfarlane, who has written a libretto which has been set to music by jazz musician Arnie Somogyi. "The audience is encouraged to listen and to look. We have created a work which will be site-specific and motion-sensitive."

Robert Macfarlane's narrative has been set to a new composition by Arnie Somogyi, one of the UK's leading jazz bass players, whose album Accident and Insurgency was developed at Aldeburgh Music. Improvisations and sound recordings of the Ness are woven into the music by Arnie and performed by local vocalist Polly Gibbons, percussionist Jim Hart, and multi-instrumentalist Neil Yates.

Blind Landing, Jane and Louise Wilson's response, refers to the Blind Landing Experimental Unit that was operational during the Cold War period. The work includes a series of sculptures inspired by a yardstick measure once employed in the film industry. Sited within the laboratory buildings, they challenge the sense of scale and ruin, pointing to the architecture of forensics and camouflage, and highlighting their historic relevance as 'future ruins'. Jane and Louise Wilson were nominated for the Turner Prize in 1999 for their disquieting study of abandoned missile silos at Greenham Common, and the deserted HQ of the Stasi in the former East Germany.

Untrue Island includes an extensive programme of community involvement. Arnie and the band have already performed to pupils at Orford Primary School and at the Kings Head in Orford, where the audience had the chance to hear some of the music whilst still in development. Local writers and artists have been invited to meet the artists and this year's community open day on the Ness will

include a walk to see the sculptures and attend performances. There is also a project with the National Trust's volunteers on Orford Ness to record and publish their reminiscences and a public talk at the University Campus Suffolk (UCS).

The project is part of the National Trust's Trust New Art programme and was developed by Commissions East and the National Trust, with funding from Arts Council England, the National Trust, Sfumato Foundation and the PRS Foundation. Many local individuals and organisations have contributed to the project, including Aldeburgh Music, the New Orford Town Trust, Nick Edgerton, and Mike Woolard.

Untrue Island is part of the London 2012 Festival, a spectacular 12-week nationwide celebration from 21st June and running until 9<sup>th</sup> September 2012 bringing together leading artists from across the world with the very best from the UK.

There will be three performances for local residents only on Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> July as part of Orford Ness' annual community open day, and for a wider audience on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> July. The sculptures can be viewed on certain dates in July, when normal National Trust prices apply for the ferry crossing.
