#### NEW ORFORD TOWN TRUST AND ORFORD AND GEDGRAVE PARISH COUNCIL

The Parish Council is the Trustee for the New Orford Town Trust and therefore the elected Councillors

automatically become Trustees of the Trust.

However, it is important to recognise that the two bodies operate and are administered as entirely separate entities. The Trust is controlled by its Trust Deed and Charity Commission rules whereas the Council operates under Local Authority legislation. Separate meetings with specific agendas are held for each body.

All financial matters including accounts and bank accounts are kept separately with specific audit arrangements for each.

#### **ORFORD AND GEDGRAVE PARISH COUNCIL**

#### RECREATION GROUND DAMAGE

There has been a small vandalism problem on the Recreation Ground. This is taking place on the children's play area, with people breaking off the wooden slats that surround this area. This fence was purchased with help from generous donors and is a necessary safeguard to allow the play area to remain accessible to children. It is a Health and Safety requirement that the area is fenced in to exclude dogs and to keep the children in a safe environment. With the damage to the slats, small children are able to climb through the fence and as the slats are broken off this exposes nails. Should the damage continue once the fencing is mended, this popular play area may have to be closed down.

#### **NEW ORFORD TOWN TRUST VILLAGE FUND**

As reported at the Annual Parish Meeting the aims of the Town Trust are to:

- Look after and maintain Trust Assets
- Pay the running expenses of the Trust
- Maintain and where possible improve the quality of life for the community
- Use surplus income for the benefit of the Community

The Trustees have set up a Village Fund account into which surplus funds, after reserving money for significant future expenditure on Trust assets (Estates, Highways and Riverside), are to be placed.

For the year ending on  $31^{st}$  March 2013, the Trust had a surplus of £47,589. The Trustees have decided to place £37,500 into the Reserve accounts, allowing £10,089 to be added to the Village Fund Account which now stands at £20,134.

After discussion the Trustees have decided to look into using some of this surplus for :

- Enhancement of the Recreation Ground facilities through installing an outdoor gym incorporating an all-weather table tennis table
- 2. Offering sponsorship for young persons to partake in activities designed for personal development such as Outward Bound Activity, Voluntary Service Overseas and Tall Ship crewing
- 3. A fund of £5,000 to be used for bids from the local community for local causes or activities it is anticipated that this fund would be divided between a number of individual bids and not used on one application
- 4. To assist the redevelopment of the Recreation Ground Hut when further details are available and funding grants are in place
- 5. To assist in obtaining apprenticeships, training, retraining and employment (and related travel)
- 6. To support volunteers in on-going village activities

# Suffolk libraries ... expanding horizons

Not everyone may realise what the library service in Suffolk has to offer them.

As well as books you can also hire CDs and DVD titles for a small charge. You can get online for free in all libraries - ideal for filling out job applications or keeping in touch if you've not got a computer at home.

There are a wide range of activities - Bookstart, Baby Bounce and Tot Rock story sessions for young children and Top Time groups for older people.

We also provide free Bookstart packs for babies and three year olds.

From  $21^{\text{st}}$  July to early September all of our libraries will be offering children the chance to take part in the Summer Reading Challenge which is a fun and rewarding way of encouraging children to keep reading during the holidays. You can find out more at your nearest library.

The library is a great place for the community to come together to share information and even if you can't get to your nearest library easily, it can come to you!

The mobile library visits 200 villages and hamlets and 475 stops in Suffolk. Each stop is visited every four weeks. There is also an At Home Library Service which involves volunteers delivering books to people who find it difficult to get to a library or mobile library stop - usually because they are older or disabled.

You can also access and browse the full library catalogue from www.suffolklibraries.co.uk and we even offer access to a range of free eBooks and eAudio books. It's free and easy to sign up to be a library user and if you have any queries about any of our services or activities you can find plenty of information on our website or call Suffolk Libraries Direct on 01473 584563.

All of Suffolk's library services are now run by Suffolk Libraries which is an independent and charitable organisation supported by Suffolk County Council.
